A steady, wide section of the Avon consisting of approximately appears. Roach and perch show throughout with good bream catches coming from the middle pegs. Large chub to 4lb plus the odd barbel and carp to double figures have also been recorded. Numerous pleasure weights of 50-60lbs have been taken especially when river conditions are ideal for the large roach shoals.

Many pegs lend themselves strongly to pole tactics as good depths can be found on the inside line of most, but good catches can also be had on waggler and stick float.

If you are after bream, then open ended groundbatt feeder tactice take some beating. Best hook batt is caster and red worm.

No need to ball in large amounts of groundbait as the bream respond well to a softly, softly approach. (The same bream can be suckers for float fished bread!)
