Manor Farm

MANOR FARM

The river at Manor Farm, Luddington consists of permanent pegs. It was at this venue that the 1984 World Championships were staged.

Predominately a chub water but more and barbel are being caught in the 8lb + weight range throughout the match length. Best match weights recorded were 66lbs and 48lbs both from the 'gully' section. (Top pegs nearest the lock).

The early season use of keepnets in this area is restricted, solely due to the extraordinary numbers of chub and barbel that inhabit this area.

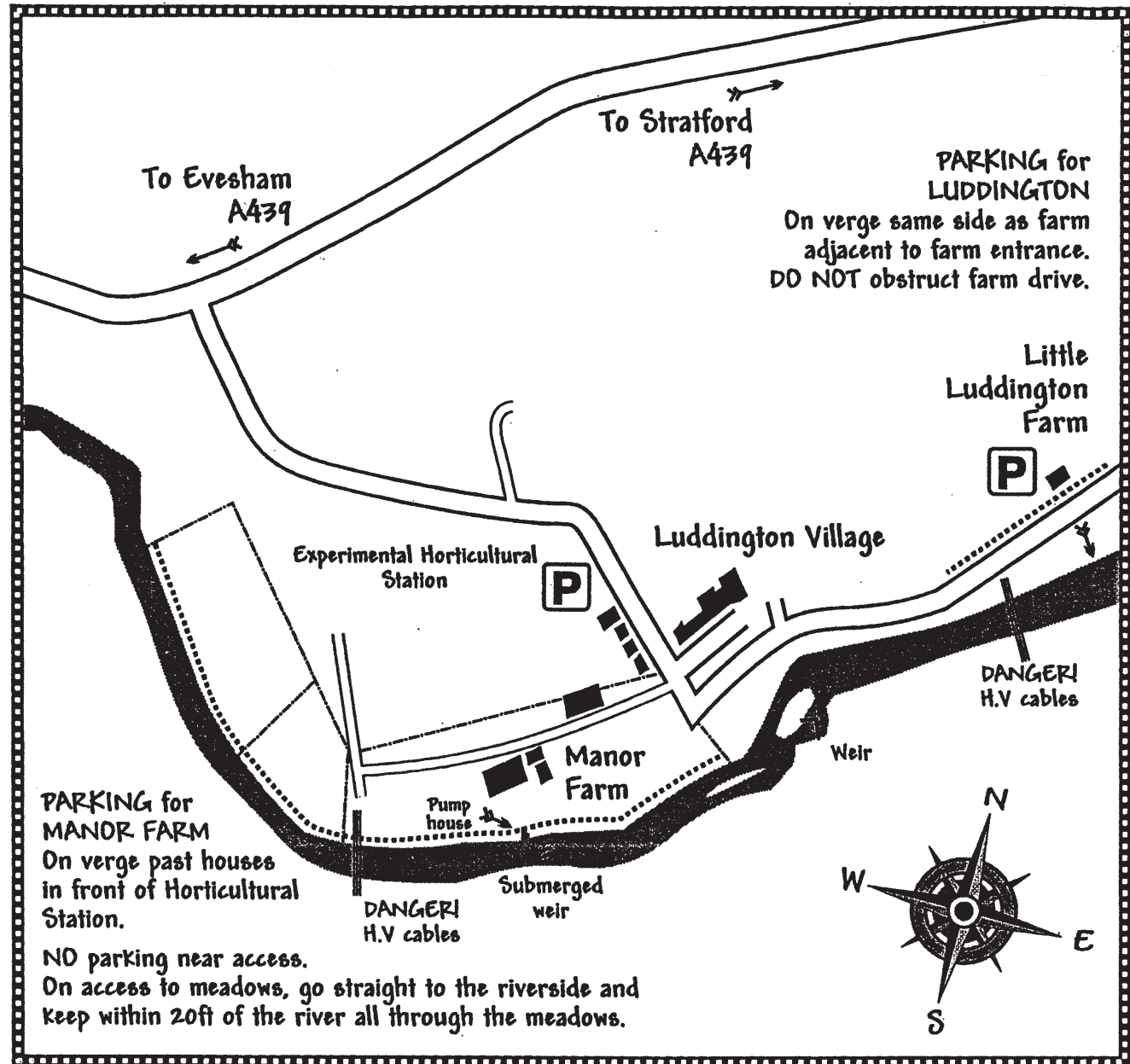
Pleasure session weights of 100lbs + were common, so the decision to restrict keepnets was taken by the committee to protect the fish stocks from undue suffering in overcrowded nets.

The middle reaches of this water also throw up good chub, barbel and roach catches with bream showing towards the lower end of the venue.

Best methods at Manor Farm are waggler and stick float but excellent catches are made on the feeder, especially when the river is carrying extra water.

Notes from Lewis:

Manor Farm is probably a better bet for barbel. Fish the sunken weir or the long straight after it, it always holds good fish, but most people tend to fish the first couple of pegs up by the lock which are again very early season pegs.
