STANNELLS

A dace and chub venue consisting of approximately 20 pegs that are easily float fished. Maggot is generally the best all round bait used in conjunction with light terminal tackle and small hooks.

Hemp and tares have taken some good weights in Summer and Autumn.

Predominately small fish but recent catches of large tench and barbel have been reported and some good weights of bream from lower pegs.

SEVEN MEADOWS

A long section that runs from the new by-pass bridge downstream to the old Stannells railway bridge. Day tickets are available for non-association members on this bank. The fishing is good and varied where many different methods produce a wide variety of species.

Large bream reside above the weir as do chub and roach with the odd tench showing. Below the weir barbel of 9lbs+ have been taken from the shallow run off that exists before the weir pool, where pike are also found. Various baits take the barbel,

luncheon meat being favourite. (MEAT TINS ARE BANNED FROM ALL SAA VENUES - LEAVE THEM AT HOME!)

From the weir pool downstream to Stannells Bridge, chub and dace will make up the bulk of the catches. The whole section is popular for matches and has thrown up some very good weights.
